

CEPESE . RESEARCH CENTRE FOR THE STUDY OF POPULATION, ECONOMY

AND SOCIETY is a non-profit organization devoted to scientific research, with an inter-University nature, founded in 1990. It statutes are published in the Portuguese Official Newspaper.

Currently, CEPESE has over 300 individual associates, from the most diverse fields of knowledge, as well as 20 collective partners and honour patrons.

Besides its own projects, CEPESE develops research projects in collaboration with other universities and national and foreign research centres, some of them via collaboration protocols.

The research is developed in the most diverse areas of History, Cultural Heritage, Art, International Relations, and Population and Foresight, supporting the accomplishment of studies, propitiating the debate of the research results in regular and multidisciplinary seminars, promoting their publication in its own journal, edited since 1995, População e Sociedade (Population and Society), which integrates ERIH (History) and LATINDEX reference indexes, and through CEPESE book collections. CEPESE has its own premises, in an autonomous building from the University of Porto, which includes a Library and Documentation Center with over 8 000 volumes. some of them very rare. All titles can be searched in our website (including the articles of the most relevant scientific journals). The base financing of CEPESE is assured by the Portuguese Foundation for Science and Technology by the research projects carried out, by the support granted

by scientific patronage and by the

fees paid by collective and individual associates.

Regarding its corporate bodies, CEPESE has a *General Assembly*, an *Executive Board*, a *Fiscal Council* and a *Scientific Council*. Besides, CE-PESE is supported by a permanent staff that ensures the regular functioning of the Centre.

CEPESE MISSION To develop research in History and Social Sciences, through the publication and divulging of the obtained results in books, in accredited national and foreign journals, and in Digital CEPESE;

in Digital CEPESE; To promote and spread the scientific culture throughout the Portuguese society, thus contributing for the development of the information and communication society; To strengthen the Portuguese presence in the world, by means of the relations established with the international scientific community, giving a special importance to Southern European countries and to the Portuguese-speaking countries; To train and support, both scientifically and materially, young researchers, namely those preparing master and doctorate theses.







RESEARCH UNIT In the scope of its aims, since 1996 CEPESE also functions as a Research Unit in the field of History, with the same name, coordinated by Fernando de Sousa, depending on the Foundation for Science and Technology, under the rules established by the Ministry of Science, Technology and Higher Education, gathering more than 100 PhD researchers from twenty Portuguese Higher Education institutions, as well as 50 non-PhD researchers.

As an FCT's Research Unit, CEPESE is composed of five Research Groups:

Portuguese Art and Cultural Heritage Economy, Society and Politics of Contemporary Portugal

Medieval and Renaissance Studies
Population and Foresight
Portuguese Foreign Relations

CEPESE Research Unit also has a Scientific Counselling Committee, composed of 14 full professors from Portuguese, Spanish, French, Italian and Brazilian universities, whose role is to appreciate the annual activity of the Unit and to present a report about it. In the extent of FCT's "Programme contracts with institutions in the national science and technology system", with the purpose of strenghthening the Portuguese scientific structure. CEPESE counts with four PhD researchers working full-time, developing their own scientific projects. Furthermore, CEPESE hosts several doctorate and postdoctorate students, including students from foreign universities, as well as university students in the scope of FCT's "Integration into research grants", with the purpose

of developing critical thinking, creativity and autonomy by joining research projects.

In the last international evaluation (2008), CEPESE obtained the rating "Very Good", the highest granted to research units in the field of History.


